Sec. 4. 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, upon completion of the educational requirements of paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of section 3 of this regulation, an applicant for an endorsement must *demonstrate requisite supervised training or experience assessing and treating couples and families. Supervised training or experience may be demonstrated by documentation of licensed experience in another state or by completion of an endorsement internship in Nevada.* ~~[obtain supervised experience by completing at least 750 hours of face-to-face couples or family counseling and at least 150 hours of supervision related to that counseling, provided by a supervisor who meets the requirements of subsection 3.]~~

2. *Those demonstrating requisite supervised training or experience assessing and treating couples and families through licensed experience in another state, must provide documentation of at least 750 hours of face-to-face couples or family counseling and at least 150 hours of supervision related to that counseling, provided by a supervisor who meets the requirements of subsection 5.*

3. *Those demonstrating requisite supervised training or experience assessing and treating couples and families through a post-graduate endorsement internship in Nevada must provide documentation of at least 500 hours of face-to-face couples or family counseling and at least 100 hours of supervision related to that counseling, provided by a supervisor who meets the requirements of subsection 5.*

~~[2].~~ 4. Before starting the supervised experience required by subsection ~~[4]~~ 3 in the State, a clinical professional counselor or clinical professional counselor intern must submit to the Board:

(a) A supervised experience proposal on a form prescribed by the Board;
and

(b) A contract for supervised experience with a supervisor who meets the requirements of subsection 3.

~~[3]~~ 5. For the purposes of this section, a person is qualified to supervise a clinical professional counselor or clinical professional counselor intern seeking to complete the supervised experience required pursuant to subsection 1 in this State if the person is:

(a) Designated by the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy or its successor organization as an Approved Supervisor;

(b) A marriage and family therapist who has been designated as a primary supervisor approved by the Board pursuant to NAC 641A.182;

(c) A marriage and family therapist who the Board has determined possesses qualifications that are substantially equivalent to the qualifications required for a primary supervisor pursuant to NAC 641A.182.

(d) A clinical professional counselor who the Board has determined possesses qualifications that are substantially equivalent to the qualifications required for a primary supervisor pursuant to NAC 641A.182.

A clinical professional counselor or clinical professional counselor intern may meet the requirements for supervised experience required pursuant to subsection 1 by completing outside of this State at least 750 hours of face-to-face couples or family counseling and at least 150 hours of supervision related to that counseling by a supervisor. A clinical professional counselor or clinical professional counselor intern must provide proof to the Board that:~~

~~_____ (a) The supervisor was, at the time of the supervised experience:~~

~~_____ (1) Designated by the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy or its successor organization as an Approved Supervisor; or~~

~~_____ (2) A person who is trained and qualified to assess and treat couples and families and who the Board has determined possess qualifications that are substantially equivalent to the qualifications required for a primary supervisor approved pursuant to NAC 641A.182]~~

6. Those demonstrating requisite supervised training or experience assessing and treating couples and families through a post-graduate endorsement internship in Nevada may count a maximum of 200 face-to-face couples or family counseling hours accrued during their graduate training, provided those hours were provided by a supervisor who meets the requirements of subsection 5.
